COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN THE CALENDAR YEAR 1931.

The cumulative total of commercial failures in Canada for 1931, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, was 2,216 as compared with 2,402, 2,167 and 2,037 for 1930, 1929 and 1928 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for 1931 were \$52,552,900 as compared with \$48,164,065, \$38,747,638 and \$32,455,437 for 1930, 1929 and 1928. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable increase from 1930, 1929 and 1928. The Maritime Provinces, Ontario and British Columbia showed an increase in number of failures while Quebec and the Prairie Provinces showed a decrease.

Commercial failures in trade in 1931 numbered 1,102 as compared with 1,204 in 1930, 1,100 in 1929 and 884 in 1928. In manufactures, there were 464 failures in 1931, as against 488 failures in 1930, 443 in 1929, and 505 in 1928. Failures of agriculturists showed an increase from 115 in 1930 to 125 in 1931 and may be compared with 125 in 1929. More detailed information regarding the classes of business in which failures occurred in 1931 is given in Table 4.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN DECEMBER, 1931

A decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was recorded in December, 1931, as compared with December, 1930, while the liabilities of the assignors also showed a considerable decrease. Commercial failures numbered 196, as compared with 239 in the same month of the previous year, and 213 in November, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,957,235 in December, 1931, as compared with \$4,335,646 in November, 1931, indicated a decrease; when compared with \$4,202,599 in December, 1930, a decrease is also noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.— In the month under review, there were 16 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 14 in November, 1931, and 11 in December, 1930. The liabilities of the assignors in December, 1931, were approximately \$136,000.

Quebec.— In Quebec, failures in December, 1931, totalled 72 as compared with 78 in November, 1931, and 98 in December, 1930. The liabilities in December, 1931, were approximately \$1,227,000. Of these 72 failures, 43 with liabilities of about \$823,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.— Commercial failures in Ontario aggregated 68, as compared with 82 in November, 1931, and 76 in December, 1930. The liabilities in December, 1931, were approximately \$1,006,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 23 assignments with liabilities of about \$434,000.

Prairie Provinces.— In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 26 in November, 1931, to 31 in December, 1931, and may be compared with 43 in December, 1930. Liabilities were approximately \$493,000, principally in Alberta. There were 6 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about \$56,000.

British Columbia.— In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 9, as compared with 13 in November, 1931, and 11 in December, 1930. The liabilities were about \$96,000. Of these 9 failures, 7 took place in the city of Vancouver with liabilities of about \$87,000.

FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.— Trading establishments furnished as usual the largest number of failures, 101 assigning in December, 1931, as compared with 104 in November, 1931, and 126 in December, 1930. Of the 101 concerns assigning in December, 1931, 12 were general stores, 9 grocery, 7 confectionery, 8 fish and meat, 5 boots and shoes, 5 dry goods, 17 clothing, 3 furniture, 8 automobile, 4 hardware, 3 electric apparatus, 2 jewelry, 2 coal and wood and 2 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.— Manufacturing establishments to the number of 39 assigned in December, 1931, as against 37 in November of the same year, and 47 in December, 1930. The 39 included 8 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in animal foods, 6 in fur and leather goods, 6 in clothing, 2 in lumber and its manufactured products, 3 in non-ferrous metals and 2 in non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture.— Agriculturists assigning in December, 1931, numbered 13 as compared with 17 in November, 1931, and 9 in December, 1930.

Miscellaneous.— There were 5 failures in construction, 4 in transportation, and 1 in logging, fishing and trapping.

Statistical Tables.— The commercial failures in each month from January, 1928 are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnished statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January, 1928 to December, 1931. The detailed figures of failures during December, 1931, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3 and for the year in Table 4. The assets and liabilities of those failing during December, 1931, are shown by provinces in Table 5, and by provinces for the years 1929, 1930 and 1931 in Table 6.






