## COMRERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN MARCH, 1931

As compared with March, 1930, a decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in March, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors also showed a decrease. Commercial failures numbered 178 in Karch, 1931, as compared with 201 in the same month of the previous year, and 188 in February, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, anounting to $\$ 3,184,198$ as compared with $\$ 4,789,701$ in February, 1931, showed a decrease; when compared with $\$ 4,310,085$ in March, 1930, a decrease is also noted.

## Commercial Failures by Areas

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review, there were 8 assignments in the Maritime Frovinces, as compared with 8 in February, 1931, and 9 in March, 1930، The liabilities were about $\$ 39,000$.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during March, 1931, numbered 64 , as agai nst 71 in February, 1931, and 92 in March, 1930. The liabilities vere approximately $\$ 1,087,000$. Of these 64 failures, 28 with liabilities of about $\$ 482,000$ were in the city of Montreal.

Ontario:- In Ontario; tho failures numbered 60, as against 59 in February, 1931, and 69 in March, 19301 Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 1,213,000$. In the city of Toronto, there were 18 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 212,000$.

Prairie Provinces6- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 43 in February, 1931, to 37 in Narch, 1931, and may be compared with 25 in liarch, 1930. The liabilitics were approximately $\$ 670,000$, mainly in Alberta. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about $\$ 30,000$.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 9 as compared :ith 7 in Februzry, 1931, and 6 in March, 1930. The liabilitios wero approximately $\$ 175,000$. There were 5 failures in the city of Vancouver, with liabilitios of about $\$ 159,000$.

Commercial Failures by Branches of Business
Trade. - Trading establishrents furnished the largest number of failures, 92 assigning in March, 1931, as compared wi th 91 in February, 1931, and 101 in March. 1930. Of those concerns, 15 were goneral stores, 8 grocery, 5 confectionery, 7 fish and meat, 4 boots and shoes, 7 clothing, 5 furniture, 4 automobilc, 5 hardware, 4 jewelry and 3 cocl and wood.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 40 assigned in Warch, 1931, us against 36 in February, 1931, and 36 in March, 1930. The 40 included 8 ungeged in the menufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in animal foods, 5 in fur and loather, 5 in clothing, 4 in lumbsr and its monfactured products, ana 3 in the manufacturo of non-forrous metals.
hgriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in March, 1931, numberod 9 as compared with 13 in Fobruary, 1931, and 16 in March, 1930.

Miscullancous. - There were 4 failures in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilitios and z in sorvico.

## CUIULATIVE THREE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND IIABILITIES

Tho cumulative total of commercial failures for the first three months of 1931 wers 606, as compared with 667, 646 and 549 for the same periods of 1930, 1929 and 1928. The total failures in trade in the first three months of 1931 were 304, as compared with 349,307 and 226 for the same periods of 1930,1929 and 1928. In manufactures, 124 failures in the elapsed period of 1931 may be compared with 130 , 166 and 135 in the seme period of the threo preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first threo months of 1931 were $\$ 11,944,578$, as compared with $\$ 17,091,691$, $\$ 13,143,172$ and $\$ 7,382,987$ for the same periods of tho three preceding years.
