

COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN MAY, 1931

As compared with May, 1930, a slight decrease in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in May, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors showed a slight increase. Commercial failures numbered 163 in May, 1931, as compared with 166 in the same month of the previous year, and 175 in April, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$2,970,116 as compared with \$3,081,427 in April, 1931, showed a considerable decrease; when compared with \$2,600,755 in May, 1930, a slight increase is noted.

COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review there were 7 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 10 in April, 1931, and 2 in May, 1930. The liabilities were about \$34,000.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during May, 1931, numbered 56, as against 53 in April, 1931, and 60 in May, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$1,172,000. Of these 56 failures, 28 with liabilities of about \$732,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Onterio. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 65, as against 67 in April, 1931 and 65 in May, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$1,022,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 14 failures with liabilities of about \$394,000.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures totalled 27 as compared with 40 in April of the present year, and 29 in May, 1930. The liabilities were about \$285,000, the largest amount being in Saskatchewan. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg, with liabilities of about \$56,000.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures mumbered 9 as compared with 5 in April of the present year and 10 in May, 1930. The liabilities were approximately \$457,000. There were 2 failures in the city of Vancouver, with liabilities in the neighbourhood of \$343,000.


COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 81 assigning in May, 1931 as compared with 89 in April, 1931 and 82 in May, 1930. Of these concerns, 13 were general stores, 8 grocery, 5 confectionery, 3 fish and meat, 3 boots and shoes, 5 dry goods, 8 clothing, 3 furniture, 4 automobile, 2 electric apparatus, 3 jewelry, 3 coal and wood and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 35 assigned in May, 1931, as against 40 in April, 1931, and 33 in May, 1930. The 35 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in fur and leather, 6 in clothing, 5 in lumber and manufactures, and 2 in non-ferrous metals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in May, 1931, numbered 9, as compared with 8 in April, 1931, and 7 in May, 1930.

<u>Miscellaneous.</u> - There were 3 failures in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilities and 20 in service.



CUMULATIVE FIVE MONTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURES AND LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first five months of 1931 s 944, as compared with 1,027, 1,005, 835 and 760 for the same periods of 1930, 1929, 928 and 1927 respectively. The total failures in trade for the first five months of 1931 were 475 as compared with 527, 491 and 350 for the same periods of 1930, 1929 and 1928; in manufactures 199 for the first five months may be compared with 207, 239 and 210 for the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first five months of 1931 were \$17,996,421, as compared with \$24,002,531, \$18,069,077 and \$11,979,969 for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease when compared with the same periods of 1930 and 1929.






