## COMGCIAI FAIITHS IN CANDA IN SFPMFBMR, 1931.

A decrease in the number of assicgments under the Banlouptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in September, 1931, as compared with September, 1930, while the liabilities of the assignors showed an increase. Commercial failures numbered 165 as compared with 192 in the same month of the previous year, and 155 in August, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, anouning to $35,166,575$, as compared with $\$ 2,081,447$ in Septenber, 1930, showed an increase. When compared with $2,350,994$ in August, 1931, an increase is also noted.

## COMTRCIAL FAJUNES BY $\angle R E A S$

Maritime Provinces.- In thenth waer review, there 9 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 9 in Avgust, 1931, and 5 in September, 1930. The liabilities in September, 1931, were about 51,000.

Quebec- Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during Sewtember, 1931, numbered 67, as against 53 in August, 1931, and 86 in September, 1930. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 2,065,000$. Of these 67 failures, 28 with liabilities of about 31,263,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.- In Cntario, the failures numbered 58 as against 60 in August, 1931, and 68 in September, 1930. Liabilities aggregated about 1.783,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 18 failures with liabilities of about 3498,000 .

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 27 in August, 1931, to 24 in September, 1931, anc may be compared with 26 in September, 1930. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,100,000$, principally in Manitoba. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about $\$ 610,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commencial failures numbered 7 as compared with 6 in August, 1931 , and 7 in September, 1930. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 167,000$. Of these failures, 5 with liabilities of about $\$ 124,000$ were in the city of vancouver.

## FAILURES BY BRANCEES OF BUSITESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 77 assigning in September, 1931, as compared with 78 in August, 1931, and 97 in September, 1930. Of these concerns, 10 were general stores, 7 grocery, 7 confectionery, 5 fish and meat, 5 boots and shoes, 6 dy goous, 8 clothing, 7 autmobile, 2 hardware, 2 jewelry, 1 electrical apparatus and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 33 assigned in September, 1931, as against 34 in August, 1931, and 40 in September, 1930. The 33 included 4 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 5 in fur and leather, 7 in clothing, 4 in lumber and its manufactured products and 2 in non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in October, 1931, numbered 14, as compared with 8 in Auqust, 1931, and 8 in September, 1930.

Miscellaneous.- There were 4 failures in construction, 5 in transportation and public utilities and 3 in finence.

## CUTUATIVE RTE MOMPHS' TOTAL OF FALURES AMD LIABIITISS

The cunulative totai of comercial failures for the first nine months of 1931 was 1,501, as compared wiith $1,725,1,589$ and 1,414 for the same periods of 1930, 1929 and 1928 respectively. The total failures in trade in the rirst nine months of 1931 were 790 as compared with 870, 791 and 601 for the same periods of 1930,1929 and 1928. In manufactures, 343 failures in the elapsed period of 1931 , may be compared with 351,346 and 352 in the same puriods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liaibilities for the first nine months of 1931 were $32,881,623$, as compared with $\$ 36,648,418, \$ 26,618,648$ and $\$ 20,756,502$ for the same periods of the three preceding years.
