## OOMRPCTS TAITUES IN DANADA TN JATK PY， 1932

Ls compared with Janalay，1931，the nurter of assignments under the Bank－ ruptcy and Winding $U_{\mu}$ fcts，as reporied to tine Duninion Eur about the same，while the iabilities of the assignors showed a sight increase． Commercial failues mubered $230^{\circ}$ in onnuary， 1932 as compared with $2+0$ in the same monti of the previols year，and 196 in December，19zi．The liabiliiies of the assign－ ors，emcunting to 4 considerable increase；whei compred thith $\$ 3,970,679$ in jenuary，1931，a slight increase is noted．

## CO：MRECIAT FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces．．．In the month inder review，there were 15 ascipnments in the Maritime Provnces，as compared mith 16 in December，1931，and 16 in January， 1931. The liabilities of the assignors in January，1932，were about $\$ 105,000$ ．

Quebec．．．Commercial failvres in the Province of Quebec during January，1932， numbered 82 as ag2inst 72 in Decenber，1931，and 80 in January，1931．The liabilities wel approximately $\$ 1,177,0000^{\circ}$ ．Of these 82 failures， 43 with liabilities of about $\$ 502,000$ took place in the citer of Montra？

Ontario．．．In Cntario，the failures numbered 91 as against 68 in December， 1931，and 87 in J nuary，1931．Tabilities ageregated ebout $\$ 1,651,000$ ．In the city of Coronto，there vere 13 assigmonts vitia iiebilities of about $\$ 362,000$ ．

Prairio Provinces，－In the threo Preirio Provinces，failures increased from 31 in December， 1931 to 55 in Janu2iy， 1932 ，and may be compared with 46 in January， 1931．The liabilivies were coproximately $\$ 638,000$ 。 中here were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of inours \＄25j，002．

British Columbin－In British Columbia conmercial failures numbered 15 as compared witi 9 in Deceriber，535．and 11 in Jeruar＂，1931．The lizbilities were ap－ pro：imately $\$ 489,000$ ．Of these 15 failures， 9 ．ithin lizbilities of about $\$ 134,000$ ．．．．．．． in the city of vencruver．

## TATLURES BY BRANGIDS OE BUS：TFSS

Trade．Trading establishments fumished the la－gest number of fallures， 121 assigning in January， 1932 ，as compared with 101 in Decem er，1931，and 121 in January， 1931．Of the se concerns， 20 were general stores， 9 grocery， 5 confectionery， 2 drink and tobacco， 3 fien and meat，$E$ bonts and shoes， 8 dry go as， 17 clothing， 4 books and stationery， 6 automobile， 4 hardware， 4 electric apparatis， 5 ewelry， 4 coal and wood and 3 drugs and chenicais．

Manvfoctures－Manfacturing establishments to the nu ber of 44 assigned in January，1932，is against 39 in December，193？，ard 48 ir January，1931．The 44 in－ cluded 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foocis， 2 in antmal foods， 5 in fur and leather coous， 3 in textiles， 7 in clothing， 4 in lumber and iss manufactured products， 2 in non．ferrous metals and 5 ir non－metallic minerais．

Agric lureo．－Agriculturists assigning in Januar．1932，numbered 20 as com－ pared wih 13 in Jecember，1931，find 5 in Jenuary， 1931.

Miscellaneous．－Therg were 5 feifures in construction， 3 in transportation， 1 in zinance and 29 in service．

Statistical Tables．－The commercial failures in each month from January， 1929 are given by provinces in Table l，while Table 2 fumishes sta istics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from Jenuary， 1929 to January，1932．The de－ tailed fisures of failures duting Jariuar．193？．2m shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3．The assets and liabilities of those failing durin Janary．1932， are show by provinces in table $4_{4}$ ．
