#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN JANU RY, 1932

As compared with January, 1931, the number of assignments under the Bank-ruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Burner of Statistics, remained about the same, while the liabilities of the assignors showed a slight increase. Commercial failures numbered 23% in January, 1932 as compared with 240 in the same month of the previous year, and 196 in December, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to 04,000 MM, as compared with \$2,957,235 in December, 1931, showed a considerable increase; when compared with \$3,970,679 in January, 1931, a slight increase is noted.

#### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces. In the month under review, there were 15 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 16 in December, 1931, and 16 in January, 1931. The liabilities of the assignors in January, 1932, were about \$105,000.

Quebec. Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during January, 1932, numbered 82 as against 72 in December, 1931, and 80 in January, 1931. The liabilities were approximately \$1,177,000. Of these 82 failures, 43 with liabilities of about \$502,000 took place in the city of Montreal,

Ontario. In Ontario, the failures numbered 91 as against 68 in December, 1931, and 87 in January, 1931. Mabilities aggregated about \$1,651,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 13 assignments with liabilities of about \$362,000.

Prairie Provinces. In the three Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 31 in December, 1931, to 35 in January, 1932, and may be compared with 46 in January, 1931. The liabilities were approximately \$638,000. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about \$255,000.

British Columbia. In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 15 as compared with 9 in December, 1931, and 11 in January, 1931. The liabilities were approximately \$489,000. Of these 15 failures, 9 with liabilities of about \$134,000 until the city of Vencouver.

#### FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS


Trade. Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 121 assigning in January, 1932, as compared with 101 in December, 1931, and 121 in January, 1931. Of these concerns, 20 were general stores, 9 grocery, 5 confectionery, 2 drink and tobacco, 3 fish and meat, 6 boots and shoes, 8 dry goods, 17 clothing, 4 books and stationery, 6 automobile, 4 hardware, 4 electric apparatus, 5 jewelry, 4 coal and wood and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures, - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 44 assigned in January, 1932, as against 39 in December, 1931, and 48 in January, 1931. The 44 included 5 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in animal foods, 5 in fur and leather goods, 3 in textiles, 7 in clothing, 4 in lumber and its manufactured products, 2 in non-ferrous metals and 5 in non-metallic minerals.

Agriculture. - Agriculturists assigning in January, 1932, numbered 20 as compared with 13 in December, 1931, and 5 in January, 1931.


Miscellaneous. There were 5 failures in construction, 3 in transportation, 1 in finance and 29 in service.

Statistical Tables.— The commercial failures in each month from January, 1929 are given by provinces in Table 1, while Table 2 furnishes statistics of commercial failures by branches of business by months from January, 1929 to January, 1932. The detailed figures of failures during January, 1932, are shown by provinces and branches of business in Table 3. The assets and liabilities of those failing durin January, 1932, are shown by provinces in Table 4.




