

**COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN THE CALENDAR YEAR 1932**

The cumulative total number of commercial failures in Canada for 1932, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, was rather higher at 2,420 as compared with 2,216, 2,402 and 2,167 for 1931, 1930 and 1929 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for 1932 were \$51,629,303 as compared with \$52,552,900, \$48,164,065 and \$38,747,638 for 1931, 1930 and 1929 respectively. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a decrease of nearly \$1,000,000 as compared with 1931. The Maritime Provinces, Quebec and Ontario showed an increase in number of failures while Manitoba and Saskatchewan showed a decrease in number and the numbers for Alberta and British Columbia remained the same.

Commercial failures of trading establishments in 1932 numbered 1,171 as compared with 1,102 in 1931, 1,204 in 1930 and 1,100 in 1929. In manufactures, there were 468 failures in 1932, as against 464 in 1931, 488 in 1930, and 443 in 1929. Failures of agriculturists showed an increase from 115 in 1930 and 125 in 1931 to 190 in 1932. More detailed information regarding the classes of business in which failures occurred in 1932 is given in Table 4.

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## COMMERCIAL FAILURES IN CANADA IN DECEMBER, 1932.

The number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, showed no change when compared with December, 1931, while the liabilities of the assignors showed a considerable increase. Commercial failures numbered 196, as compared with 196 in the same month of the previous year, and with 229 in November, 1932. The defaulted liabilities of the assignors, amounting to \$7,836,377 in December, 1932, as compared with \$4,342,717 in November, 1932, indicated an increase; when compared with \$2,957,235 in December, 1931, an increase is also noted.

### COMMERCIAL FAILURES BY AREAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month under review there were 10 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as compared with 16 in December, 1931, and 10 in November, 1932. The liabilities in December, 1932, were about \$336,000.

Quebec.- Commercial failures in the province of Quebec during December, 1932, numbered 80 as against 72 in December, 1931, and 89 in November, 1932. The liabilities were approximately \$1,410,000. Of these 80 failures, 32 with liabilities of about \$618,000 took place in the city of Montreal.

Ontario.- In Ontario, the failures numbered 69 as compared with 80 in November, 1932, and 68 in December, 1931. Liabilities aggregated about \$5,241,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 18 failures with liabilities in the neighbourhood of \$4,224,000. One single failure accounted for \$3,575,000 of this amount.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 15 in November, 1932, to 10 in December, 1932, and may be compared with 16 in December, 1931. A considerable decrease is also noted in this later more significant comparison. The liabilities aggregated about \$570,000. There were 6 failures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilities of about \$92,000.

British Columbia.- In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 6 as against 10 in November, 1932, and 9 in December, 1931. A decrease is noted in both comparisons. In Vancouver, there were 4 failures with liabilities of about \$260,000.

### FAILURES BY BRANCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade.- Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 102 assigning in December, 1932, as compared with 105 in November, 1932, and 101 in December, 1931. Of these concerns, 20 were general stores, 11 groceries, 8 confectionery, 6 fish and meat, 2 boots and shoes, 5 dry goods, 10 clothing, 4 automobile, 1 coal and wood and 6 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures.- Manufacturing establishments to the number of 34 assigned in December, 1932, as against 47 in November, 1932, and 39 in December, 1931. The 34 included 7 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 3 fur and leather, 3 lumber and its manufactured products, 3 non-ferrous metals, and 1 drugs and chemicals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in December, 1932, numbered 14, as compared with 21 in November, 1932, and 13 in December, 1931.

Services.- In Services, the failures numbered 20 as compared with 29 in November, 1932, and 23 in December, 1931. A decrease is noted in both comparisons.

Miscellaneous.- There were 7 failures in construction, 1 in mining, and 2 in finance.




