## GOMERCII FAILUXES JN CATAIA IIT FEBRUARY, 1932

An increase in the number of assicinnts under the Bankmptey and Finding up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Stetistics, was rezorded in February, 1932, as compared with February, 1932, while the liabj.isties showed a decrease, Commercial failures numbered 221, as compared with 1.88 in the same month of the previous year, and 238 in Jamuary, 1932. The liabilities of tha assignors, amounting to $\$ 3,650,728$ in February, 1932, as compared with $\$ 4,060,643$, showed a decrease in this comparison. When compared. with $\$ 4,789,701$ in February, i931, a decrease is again noted.

## COMAERGII, FAILURS BY ARBAS

Maritime Provinces.-. In the month under review, there were 12 assignments in the Maritine Provinces, as compareí with 15 in January, 1932, and 8 in Febriary, 1931. The liabilities in Febmary, 1932, were about \$111,000.

Quebec... Commercial failures in the Province of Quebec during February, 1932, numbered 9 , as against 82 in January, 1932, and 71 in February, 1931. The liabilities were approximatoly $\$ 1,372,000$. In the city of liontreal, there were 36 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 59$ ?,000.

Ontario - - In Ontario, the failures numbered 79, as compared with 91 in
 Of these 79 failures, 19 with liailities of about $\$ 447,000$ were in the city of Toronto.

Frairie Pruvinces... In the three Prairie Provinces, failures decreased from 35 in January, 1932, to 30 in February, 1932, and may be compared with 43 in February, 1931. The liabilities totalled $\$ 424,000$, principaily in Lanitoba. There were 4 failures in the city of Winnipee witin liabilities of about $\$ 161,000$.

British Columbia。 - Ia British Coluribia, comerciul failures numbered $\delta$ as compared with is in January, 1932, and $\because$ in Februarion, 1931。 in the city of Vancouver there were 4 failures with liabilities of about $\$ 54,000$.

## FAIITMES BY BRATCHES CF BUSINESS

Trade. Trading estainlishments fumished the largest number of failures, 104 assigniné in February, 1932, as comparad vith lain January, 1932, and 91 in February, 1931. Of the 104 concerns assigning, $I 1$ vere general stores, 8 grocery, 5 confectionery, 7 fish anch mot, 8 voots and shces, 5 dry goods, 14 clothing, 6 autonobile, 6 hardware, 4 electric apparatus, 4 jewelry and 3 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactureson Manufacturing establisiments to the number of 48 assigned in February, 1932, as compared wi.in 44 in Jamary, 1932, and 36 in February, 1931. The 48 included 8 engajed in vegetable foods, 4 in animel foods, 6 in fur and leather, 8 in clothing and 4 in iumber and its manufoctured products.

Kisculanenuss, Africulturists assigning in Fobruary, 1932, numbered 18 as compareú with 20 In January, 1932, and 13 in February, 1931. Five assignments were reported in constrution and 5 in transportation and public utilities.

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first two months of 1932 2as 459, as compared with 428, 466 and 466 for the same periods of 1931, 1930 and 1929. espectively. The total failures in trade in the first two months of 1932 were 225, as ompared with 212, 248 and 228 for the same periods of 1931, 1930 and 1929. In manuactures, 92 failures in the elapsed period of 1932 may be compared with 84 , 94 and 128 in the same periods of the theee precedine years. The defaulted liabilities for the first two months of 1932 were $\$ 7,711,371$, as compared with $\$ 8,760,380, \$ 12,781,606$ and $\$ 10,183,083$ for the same period of the preceding years.
