## COMMRRCIAL FAILURES IN CAIIADA INT MARCE, 1932

As compared with March, 1931, an increase in the number of assigments under the Bankruptcy and Winding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experienced in March, 1932. The liabilities of the assignors showed a slight increase. Commercial failures numbered 208 in March 1932, as compared with 178 in the same month of the previous year, and 221 in February, 1932. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 3,399,052$ as compared with $\$ 3,650,728$ in February, 1932, sinowed a decrease; when compared with $\$ 3,184,198$ in Marcin, 1931, a slight increase is noted.

## Commercial Failures by Areas

Maritime Provinces. - In the month under review, there were 13 assignments in the Maritime Provinces, as comoared mith 12 in February, 1932, and 8 in March, 1931. The liabilities were about $\$ 109,000$.

Quebec. - Comnercial failures in the Province of Quebec during March, 1932, numbered 78 , as against 92 in Febmary, 1932, and 64 in March, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,314,000$. of these 78 failures, 42 with liabilities of about $\$ 805,000$ were in the city of hontreal.

Ontario. - In Ontario, the failures numbered 68, as against 79 in February, 1932; and 60 in March, 1931. Liabilities aggregated about \$1,376,000. In the city of Toronto, there were 11 failures witil liabilities of about $\$ 320,000$.

Prairie Provinces.- In the tiree Prairie Provinces, failures increased from 30 in $\mathcal{F}$ ebruary, 1932 , to 40 in liarch, 1932, and may be compared $\pi i t h 37$ in March, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 513,000$, principally in Sasicatchewan. There were 9 failures in the city of Tinnipeg with liabilities of about $\$ 142,000$.

British Columbia. - In British Columbia, commercial failures numbered 9 as compared with 8 in February, 1932, and 9 in Karch, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 86,000$. There were 7 failures in the city of Vancouver, with Ifabilities of ábout \$52,000.

## Commercial Failures by Branches of Businoss

Trade. - Trading establishments furnished the largest number of failures, 100 assigning in March, 1932, as compared with 104 in Jebruary, 1932, and 92 in March, 1931. Of these concerns, 11 were general stores, 7 Erocery, 4 confectionery, 6 fish and meat, 5 boot and shoes, 7 dry goods, 9 clothing, 4 furniture, 3 books and stationery, 3 hardware, 4 electric apparatus, 6 coal and mood and 3 jewelry.

Manufactures. - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 37 assigned In March, 1932, as against 48 in Jebruary, 1932, and 40 in March, 1931. The 37 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 2 in andmal foods, 5 in fur and leather, 2 in textiles, 5 in clotining, 2 in lmber and its manufactured products and 4 in the manufacture of non-ferrous metals.

Agriculture.- Agriculturists assigning in Marcil, 1932, numbered 20 as


Miscellaneous.- There were 5 Sailures in construction, 3 in transportation and public utilities and 30 in service.

## CUMUATIVE TERBZ MOITTHS TOTAL OF FAILURES AMD LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of comercial failures for the first three months of 1932 mere 667, as compared with 606, 667 and 646 for the same periods of 1931 , 1930, and 1929. The total failures in trade in the first three months of 1932 were 325, as compared with 304, 349 and 307 for the same periods of 1931,1930 and 1929. In manufactures, 129 failures in the elapsed period of 1932 may be compared with 124, 130 and 166 for the same periods of 1931, 1930 and 1929. The defaulted liabilities for the first three months of 1932 were $\$ 11,108,423$ as compared with $\$ 11,944,578$, $\$ 17,091,691$ and $\$ 13,143,172$ for the same periods of the three preceding years.
