## COILWRCIAL FAILURSS IN CANADA INT APRIL, 1932

As compared with April, 1931, an increase in the number of assignments under the Bankruptcy and Tinding Up Acts, as reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics, was experiencel in April, 1932. The liabilities of the assignors showed a slight decrease. Comrnercial failuret numbered 190 in April, 1932, as compared with 175 in the same month of the previous yekr, and 208 in ifarch, 1532. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 3,170,679$ as cbmpared with $\$ 3,399,052$ in March, 1932, showed a decrease; when compared with $\$ 3,184,198$ in April, 1931, a decrease is again noted.

## COITIRCIAI TAILURES BY ARJAS

Karitime provinces, - In the month under review there were 13 assigments in the Karitime provinces, as compared with 13 in March, 1932, and 10 in April, 1931. The liabilities were about $\$ 184,000$.

Quebec, - Commercial failures in the Province of quebec during April, 1932, numbered 75, as against 78 in March, 1932, and 53 in April, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,273,000$, of these 75 failures, 32 with liabilities of about $\$ 547,000$ were in the clty of Montreal.

Ontario, - In ontario, the failures numbered 79 , as compared with 68 in april, 1932, and 67 in April', 1931. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 1,262,000$. In the city of coronto, there were 23 failures with liabilities in the neighbourhood of $\$ 528,000$.

Prairic provinces, In the three Prairie provinces, failures numbered 17 as compared with 40 in Karch, 1932, and 40 in April, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 371,000$. principaily in ilanitoba. There were 3 failures in the city of Winnipeg aith liabilities totalling $\$ 127,000$.

British, Columbia,- In British Columbia, comercial failures numbered 6 as compared with 9 in March, and 5 in April, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 80,000$. There were 3 failures in the dity of Vancouver with liabilities of about \$39,000.

## COLTGRCIAL FAILURAS BY YRAHCHES OF BUSINESS

Trade, - Trading establishnents furnished the largest number of failures, 80 assigning in April, 1932, as compared with 100 in harch, 1932, and 89 in April, 1931. of these concerns, 7 were general stores, 6 grocery, 4 confectionery, 5 fish and meat, 4 boots and shoes, 7 dry goods, 5 automobile, 2 electric apparatus, and 6 jewelry.

Kanufactures, - Manufacturing establishments to the number of 37 assigned in April, 1932, as against 37 in iarch, 1932, and 40 in April, 1931. The 37 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of vegetable foods, 4 in fur and leather, 3 in textiles, 2 in lumber and its manufactured products and 3 in the manufacture of iron and steel.

Agriculture, - Agriculturists assigning in April, 1932, numbered 19 as compared with 20 in March, 1932, and 8 in April, 1931.

Uiscellaneous, - There were 7 failures in construction, 6 in transportation, 1 in finance and 25 in service.

## CUNLATIVE FCUR OOTTHS' TOTAL OF FAILURTS AMD LIABILITIES

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first four months of 1932 were 857 , as compared with $781, \mathrm{H}_{1} 1$ and 820 for the same periods of 1931,1930 and 1929. The total fallures in trade for the first four months of 1932 were 405 , as compared with 393. 445 and 390 for the same periods of the three preceding years. The defaulted liabilities for the first four months of 1932 were $\$ 14,279,102$ as compared with * $\$ 15,026,005, \$ 21,401,776$ and $\$ 15,666,205$ for the same periods of the three preceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a considerable decrease when compared with the same period of 1931.
