## COMMERCTAJ FIILURPS FOR THE FTRET SIX MONTHS OF 1.932 AND FUR JUNE 1932

The cumulative total of commercial failures for the first six months of 1932 , as reported to the Dominion Eureau of Statistics, under the provisions of the Bankruptcy and Winding up Acts, was 2,237 as compared with $1,109,1,205$ and 1,153 for the same period of 1931,1930 and 1929 respectively. The defaulted liabilities for the first half of 1932 were $\$ 21,221,450$ as compared with $\$ 22,853,013, \$ 26,408,325$ and $\$ 21,025,946$ for the same periods of the three nreceding years. Thus defaulted liabilities showed a decreas wher compared with the same period of 1931.

Cormercial failures in trade for the first six months of 1932 were 583 as compared with 556,611 and 570 for the same periods of 1931, 1930 and 1929 respectively. In manufactures, there wele 248 in 1932 as against 238,246 and 268 for the corresponding period of the three preceding years. Agricultural failures increased from 50 in the first half of 1931 to 99 for the same period of 1932 and may be compar with 55 and 69 for the same periods of 1930 and 1929. The number of general stores failing in the first six months of 1932 was 75 as compared with 86 for the corresponding period of 1931. Forty-throe grocery stores failed in the first half of 1932, as against 51 for the saia period of 1931. There were 33 failures in fish and meat stores, 35 in boots and shoes, 42 in dry goods, 19 in heirdware and 14 in drugs and chemicals.

Statistical Tables. - The comercial failures in each month from january 1928, are dven by provinces in Table l, while Table 2 furnished statistics of commercial fallur s by brarcines of business by months from January 1928 to June 1932. The detailed

- figures of failures during Junc 2032 are shown by provinces and branches of businese in Table 3 and for the first six montis of the year jin Tahle th. The assets and liabilities of those failine during June 1932 are shove by provincos in Table 5, and the first half of 1932, is shown in Table 6.

CNMEROT FATUSNS TM CANDA IN JUNE 1932
A slight increase in the namber of ass mancots wider the Benkruptcy and
Winding up Acts, as reported tc the Nominion Bureau of Siatistics, was experionced in June, 1932. Commercial ailures mumbered 176, as compared with 165 in the same month of the previous year, and 204 in May, 1932. The liabilities of the assignors, amounting to $\$ 3,794,281$ as compared witil $\$ 3,148,067$ in May, 1932, showed a slight increase; when compared with $\$ \mathbf{\$}, 613,464$ in June 1931, a decrease is notod.

## CDMERCIAL TAITURES BY APMAS

Maritime Provinces.- In the month undor review, there were 18 assignments in the ifari cime Provinces, as compared with 14 in liay, 1932 and 14 in June, 1931 . The liabilities in junc, i932, were acout $\$ 125,000$.

Quebec. - Commercial failures in the provinco of quewo during June, 1932. numbered 61, as against 80 in liay, 1932, and 53 in June, 1931. The liabilities were approximately $\$ 1,086,503$. Of these 61 failures, 35 occurre in the city of Montreal with estimated liabilities of about \$ $\$ 82,000$.

Qntario.- In Ontario, the filures numbered 70 as against 55 in June, 1931, and 79 in May, 1.932. Liabilities aggregated about $\$ 1,906$, 208. In the city of Toronto, there were 12 assignments with liabilities 0 abou: \$227:000.

Prairie Provinces.- In the three Frairie Provinces, failures decreasod from 20 in May, 1932, to 17 in June, 1932, and may be compared with 4 in June, 1931. There were 3 fallures in the city of Winnipeg with liabilitios of about $\$ 121,000$.

British Columbia.- In Eritish Columbia, commercial failures numbered 10 as compared with 11 in MaN, 3932 , and 9 in turie, 1931. Tho liabilitios were about $\$ 40$, 000. of these 10 failures, 4 with liabilitios of about $\$ 310,000$ took placo in the city of Vancouver.

## COMURECTAL FAILUESS BY BRAYCHESOE BUSTNES

Trade. - Trading estabiishments furuished the largest number of fallures, 84 assigning in June, 1932, as compared with C' in May, 1932, and 82 in June, 1931. Of those concoins, 12 were general stores, 7 Erocery, 4 confectionery, $i$ Sish and meat, 6 boots and shoes, 4 hardware, 2 electric apparatus and 4 drugs and chemicals.

Manufactures, - Manufacturin eatablishents to the number of 35 assigned in June, 1932, as against 47 in May, 1932 and 39 in June, 153]. The 35 included 6 engaged in the manufacture of regetalle foods, 3 in enimal $f$ is, 3 in textiles, 5 in clothing, 4 in lumber and its menufectured products, 3 in non-ferrous motals and 2 in non-metallic minerals.

Agricultune.-Agriculturists assiening in Junc, 1932, numbered 11 as compared with 11 in May, 1932, and $0^{\circ}$ in jure. $193{ }^{\circ}$.

Miscel lanequs.. Thare vere 3 far ures in construction, 4 in transnortation and public utilities and 2 in logging, fishing and trapping.
