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## **NOTE RE HISTORICAL CONTINUITY**

### **(a) Indexes**

For a continuous record of the quarterly Indexes of Real Domestic Product and the monthly Indexes of Industrial Production the sources are as follows:

## TECHNICAL NOTE

### New Monthly Real Domestic Product Indexes, January, 1969 to April, 1970

These new statistical series, released to the public for the first time in Tables 5 and 6 of this report and Tables 3 and 4 of the April issue of 61-005 are a monthly expression of the previously published system of quarterly indexes of Real Domestic Product by industry. The monthly indexes should provide a more timely indication of emerging economic trends in Canada as measured by such aggregative indicators as GDP, GNP or GNE. The industrial detail now available on a monthly basis is quite extensive. Over 120 individual series and industry aggregates will henceforth be published monthly, including the approximately 80 previously published monthly Index of Industrial Production components, which, users should be reminded, form an integral part of the RDP system. The publication, on a monthly basis, of industry output indexes for the remainder of the economy should provide a better perspective and a systematic framework within which both to analyze the short-term output movements of individual industry areas, such as manufacturing, and also to pinpoint the sources of emerging stagnation or expansion for the economy as a whole, insofar as these can be detected by analyzing the output patterns of individual industries. It is hoped that the improved timeliness made possible by the release of monthly data will facilitate such analyses. The quarterly RDP indexes will for the time being continue to be published as a convenience to users. It should be noted that the quarterly indexes are a simple arithmetic average of the monthly indexes for each industry.

The publication of the monthly RDP indexes is the culmination of a major statistical development project which spanned a decade and was carried on simultaneously with other major research and revision projects in the area of industry output measurement. Although some work had been undertaken prior to the publication of the quarterly RDP indexes in 1963, following their release a concerted effort was made to

convert the entire RDP system to a monthly basis. The project was conducted in the National Output and Productivity Division under the direction of Mr. J.A.C. Parent. The basic development work of the monthly measures was completed late in 1968 and the indexes have been computed on a regular monthly schedule but on an experimental basis as of 1969. The quality, but particularly the timing, of the monthly indexes have been considerably improved during this experimental period to the point where it is felt that they can now be published on a regular monthly basis.

It should be noted that all data for 1969 and 1970 shown in this report and the April issue have been revised as usual to incorporate some basic data changes and more up-to-date seasonal factors. Indexes for the following months will be published in subsequent issues of 61-005, along with tables showing quarterly averages.

Work on the monthly RDP record for the period prior to 1969 is now in its final stages of completion. Monthly indexes of Real Domestic Product starting with January 1961 will be contained in a forthcoming reference paper planned for release later this year. The purpose of this document will be to present the final phase of the historical revisions to the industry real output system, the first phase of which was the publication in 1966 of revisions to the Index of Industrial Production to incorporate more up-to-date annual levels for the 1950's. The reference document scheduled for publication this winter will show revisions for the 1961 forward period only. The revisions will consist basically of the incorporation of more recent annual levels for all industries (including the results of the 1966 Census of Merchandising and Services), revisions to the 1961 Gross Domestic Product at factor cost distribution which forms the basis of the industry weighting system, and the incorporation of the total activity concept in manufacturing.

### Review of 1969

In 1969, Canada's Real Domestic Product rose by 5.1 per cent. While it does not quite match the 1961-69 average annual rate of growth of 5.4 per cent,<sup>1</sup> the 1969 increase in output compares favourably with the post-war growth trend of 4.7 per cent per annum, the 1968 increase of 4.5 per cent and, especially, the considerably lower rate of expansion of 2.7 per cent recorded during 1967.

The year 1969 started slowly with a small increase in production in January. This was followed, however, in February, by the year's largest month-to-month gain (1.9 per cent) and a further small advance for the month of March. As a result, the rate of advance (2.3 per cent) for the first quarter exceeded the already

substantial expansion which had occurred in the last quarter of 1968 (the third quarter of 1968 had increased only fractionally, while the second and first quarters had shown substantial gains, following the relatively depressed levels of production during most of 1967 and 1966). A small decline in production in April, 1969, and a 1.1 per cent drop in May resulted in the first fractional decline (on a quarterly basis) in total real output since the beginning of 1961. This slowdown in the economy continued through the summer months. Thus, although production gained some momentum in September, the RDP index for the third quarter stood at 152.0 (1961 = 100), the same level as for the first quarter of 1969. The year ended with a fractional increase in December which, combined with the strong (1.2 per cent expansion in November and a small advance in October, raised the fourth quarter average to 2.0 per cent above the output level of the preceding quarter. The expansion has continued in the early months of 1970.

Several major factors affected the level of industry output in 1969. There appeared to be some further expansion in external demand for Canadian products as indicated by the nearly 8.0 per cent rise in the volume of exports, led by shipments of automobile products to the United States. Domestic demand, however, was an even stronger factor. Consumer expenditures advanced by nearly 6.0 per cent and accounted for the bulk of the increase in final demand. Although the Canadian population grew at a lesser rate than in 1968 because of decreased immigration from Europe, the employed labour force expanded more rapidly than in the previous year. This was the result of higher participation rates and a marginally lower unemployment rate. On the supply side, in comparison with 1968, the major influence was the dampening effect of the more than 50.0 per cent increase in the number of man-days lost to strikes and lockouts. This loss amounted to one day for each person employed in Canada. In terms of the pattern of output within the year, strikes and lockouts clearly played a dominant role. The number of days lost rose sharply in the second quarter, reached a new peak in the third and declined in the fourth quarter, when the rise in output reflected the effect of strike recoveries. Not since the beginning of 1961 have the second, third and fourth quarters of the year recorded so many days lost in labour disputes. The largest of the major strikes occurred in the miscellaneous metal mining (nickel-copper), steel mills, iron ore mining, smelting and refining, construction, and air transport industries.

The increases in industry output were not as widespread as in 1968, when all of the twelve industry divisions rose. In 1969 two divisions declined. The decrease in mining was the most significant, and was caused by the effects of the miscellaneous metals and iron ore strikes some of which began in May and terminated in November and affected output in related industries throughout the rest of the year. The decline due to strikes more than offset the increases in the crude petroleum and natural gas industry and in non-metal mining (except coal). The decline in fishing occurred because of a decrease in the output of the Atlantic region and a drop in B.C. fishing due to a fall-off in the salmon catch.

The output gains in manufacturing dominated the overall increase in production in Canada for 1969. Within manufacturing durables and non-durables grew at the same rate. The increase in durables resulted from advances in the transportation equipment, electrical products, machinery and metal fabricating industries that more than offset a slight decrease in the strike-affected primary metal industries. For the year 1969 motor vehicle production was considerably above the 1968 levels, although a decline commenced in October and continued beyond the end of the year. Non-durables increased on the basis of a strong advance in the output of the paper and allied industries and gains in the foods and beverages, printing and publishing, and textile industries.

As in 1968, the community, business and personal services division recorded the second largest contribution to RDP, accounting for nearly one quarter of the

annual increase. Continued advances occurred in the education, business management, health and welfare, personal, and other service industries.

Wholesale and retail trade together contributed one tenth of the 1969 increase in the output of the domestic economy, with retail trade supplying the larger share. Department, food, and motor vehicle dealers showed the largest volume increases among the retail outlets, and liquor, beer and wine store sales recovered from the strike-depressed level of 1968. The most significant wholesale trade increases occurred in petroleum bulk tank stations, industrial and transportation equipment, automotive parts and accessories, and household electrical appliances.

The finance, insurance and real estate division received most of its growth from insurance and real estate, although the finance industries grew at a faster rate. The most notable factor in the transportation, storage and communication division was the lack of growth in rail and water transport, neither of which were able to increase their output during the year, primarily because of the effect of strikes in the mining industry, which pulled down the output of rail and water transport during the second and third quarters. Beginning in September, transportation, storage and communication rose, contributing more than 20.0 per cent of the increase in total RDP for the fourth quarter. Railway transport led the way, because of renewed carriage of commodities that had fallen off in volume in the previous quarter due to the iron ore, steel and nickel strikes. The largest month-to-month increase for this industry division was recorded in December. For the year as a whole continued strong upward movements in telephone systems, and increases in air transport (despite being strike-bound in April and May) and in pipeline transport (particularly gas pipelines) were also important factors.

The utilities expanded on the strength of large gains in both the electric power utilities and gas distribution. The increase in construction came entirely from residential construction, which rose sharply in the year on the strength of the first and second quarters. Scarcity of mortgage money and rising interest rates and construction costs combined to slow down residential building activities in the latter half of the year. These factors also contributed to pulling non-residential construction below its 1968 level. Within residential construction, the number of starts during the year rose to a new record, but all of the increase came from multiple-housing units.

The public administration and defence index was higher than in the previous year because increases in provincial and local administration more than offset a decrease in federal administration, which was held down by a drop in defence services. Forestry's rise, although small in terms of its impact on the national economy, was in contrast to the depressed level of operations in 1968. Pulpwood cuttings advanced in response to growth in external demand for pulp and paper, particularly from overseas markets.




