## BANK DEBITS TO INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNTS

## or

Amount of Cheques Charged against Bank Accounts at the
GLoaring House Centres in 1930

Financial transfers in the form of bank debits showed a decline of $\$ 9,179,000,000$ or about $20 \mathrm{p.c}$. . in 1930 , from the total of the preceding year. The decline was due to moderate activity in business and speculation as well as the lower prices prevailing throughout 1930 .

Decreases were general in the clearing centres of the Dominion, with the exception of Moncton, where 3 gain of $1.5 \mathrm{j} . \mathrm{c}$. was shown. The decline in Montreal was $21.2 \mathrm{j} . \mathrm{c} .$, the total in 1930 being $\$ 12,271,000,000$, compared with $\$ 15,558,000,000$ in the preceding year. Debits in Toronto were $\$ 10,655,000,000$, compared with $\$ 13,714,-$ 000,000 , a decline of $\$ 3,059,000,00$ or 22.4 p.c. The decline in winnipeg was $\$ 1,077,000,000$ or $22.4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , the total for 1930 being $\$ 3,712,000,000$ compared with $\$ 4,789,000,000$. Debits in Vancouver declined $\$ 553,000,000$ or 23.4 p.c., the total in 1930 being $\$ 1,813,000,000$ compared with $\$ 2,366,000,000$.

## Comperison by Economic Areas

The decline in 1930 from the levels of the preceding year was general in each of the econoraic areas. The percentage decline was less in the Maritime Provinces than in any other area, amounting to 11.2 p.c. The total for 1930 was $\$ 708,000,000$ compared with $\$ 798,000,000$, a decline of $\$ 89,600,000$. The total for the province of Quebec in 1930 was $\$ 13,137,000,000$, a decline of 20.4 p.c. from the preceding year. Ontario showed a decline of $\$ 3,499,000,000$ or 19.1 p.c. The total in 1930 was $\$ 15,044,000,000$ comparod with $\$ 18,243,000,000$.

The Prairie Provinces had debits in 1930 amounting to $\$ 6,279,000,000$ compared with $\$ 7,923,000,000$, a decline of $\$ 1,644,000,000$ or $20.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decrease in British Columbia was from $\$ 2,723,000,000$ to $\$ 2,322,000,000$, amounting to $\$ 600,000,000$ or 20.5 p.c.

## Comparison with 1928

Comparisons wh 1928 were more favourable than with 1929, as the high point during the period of observation was ruachod in the latter year. The decline in the aggregate for the Dominion in 1930 from the levels of 1928 was $13.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The decrease in the Naritime Provinces was limited to 5.0 p.c., while British Columbia showed a decline of $7.0 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Eliebec showed a decline of $12 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. , while Ontario and the Prairie Provinces were down 13.2 and 21.6 p.c., respectively.

## Comparison with years from 1924 to 1927

While debits in 1930 showed substantial declires compared with 2928 or 1929 , the level was considerably above each of the preceding years from 1924. to 1927. The sain in the Domirion total in 1930 over 1924 was $38 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. Continuous increases being shown from 1924 to 1927, the excess in 1930 over the latter year was limited to about $4 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. In each of the econoric areas except the Prairie Provinces, gains were shown year by year from 1924 to 1929. In the Prairie Frovinces declines were shown in 1926 and 1929 from the totals of the immediately preceding years. Totals for Canada and the economic areas from 1924 to 1930 in million dollars with percentage analysis is given in Table 6.

Statistics of bank debits as published in this bulletin are limited to returns from clearing house centres only. For the purpose of establishing the ratio of the debits in clearing centres to the total amount of debits charged to accounts at Q. Il branch banks in Canada in a particular month, a spocial enquiry was made by the Canadian Bankers' Association in regard to the amount of bank debits charged to accounts at branch banks outside of clearing house centres during Jaruary, 1929. It was determined that the total debits outside of clearing house centres were only 14.5 p.c. of the debits in clearing centres. The business done through the passage of cash from hand to hand cannot be estimated with any degres of accuracy.

## Relation ts Equation of Exchange

Since the national economy is one of money payments, of which say 85 p .0. to $95 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. are effected through exchange of cheques, a highly important indication of fluctuations in the total volume of business transactions is afforded by figures for bank debits to indiridual accounts. While the decline in bank debits in 1930 amounted to nearly $20 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$., the sum of the demand and notice deposits of the chartered banks averaged only 5.4 p.c. less in 1930 than in 1929. Deposits, since they generally owe their origin to lending and investing operations of the banks, are devendent chiefly on the volume of these operations. Owing to the slack demand for funds, current loans showed marked reduction during 1930, while investments, especially in Dominion Government bonds, showed considerable gain.

Owing to the moderate decline in bank deposits and the marked drop in bank debits, it is evident that the turnover of deposits was at a reduced level in 1930. The percentage of bank debits to deposits in 1930 was 151.5 compared with 178.0 in 1929.

In general, the volume of payments in a given year represents the product of the amount of money (chiefly deposit currency) multiplied by the number of timos it turns over. However, the volume of payment is also equal to the quantity of goods or services exchanged times the prices of the se goods and services - the other side of the familiar equation of exchange.

## Comparison with Other Factors

The decline of bank debits in 1930 from the levels of the precoding year was due to reduction in industrial production and wholesale prices with corresponding declines in the sale and prices of speculative securities. The official index of industrial production averaged 164.0 in 1930 , a decline of $14.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. from the average for 1929. The decline in the index of wholesale prices, the monthly average for the year being taken in each case, was 9.2 p.c. The average for 1930 was 86.8 compared with 95.6 in the preceding year. Measured by the official index of employment, as reported by employers, the number of working forces showed a decline of $4.8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$. The Index number of rates of wages for various classes of labour compiled by the Labour Department was 194.4 in 1930 compared with 192.7 in the preceding year, an increase of $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{c}$.

Common stocks averaged 28.6 p.c. lower in 1930 then in 1929, the official Adex being 146.2 in 1930 compared with 190.7. Speculative trading showed a sharp dealine in 1930, the number of shares sold on the Montreal stock exchange being 11,067,000 compared with 23,203,000 in 1929, a decrease of 52.3 p.c.
