

A recent survey of the 1955 capital expenditure intentions of Canadian business, institutions and governments and of individuals for housing, indicates that spending plans are being revised upwards from those outlined at the beginning of the year.

It is now estimated that capital spending in 1955 will reach \$5,954 million, which if accomplished, would be the highest total on record. This compares with the \$5,808 million anticipated earlier and the expenditure of \$5,507 million made in 1954. In total this involves a capital programme 8 per cent larger than that accomplished last year with outlays for construction being 11 per cent greater and those for the acquisition of machinery and equipment about one per cent more. Originally it had been anticipated that expenditures for machinery and equipment would be slightly lower than in 1954.

While most major investment sectors show upward revisions from the original intentions the most notable increase occurs in the manufacturing industries which now plan a capital programme 14 per cent greater than that of 1954. The increased strength in the manufacturing sector appears to be a reflection of the strong export market for Canadian goods. Of the major manufacturing industries that cater to the export market, the paper products group plans to increase its capital outlays by 73 per cent and the non-ferrous metals industry by 53 per cent. Firms in the mining sector have also expanded their investment plans and now anticipate an expenditure 28 per cent greater than in 1954.

This added strength which is apparent in the export industries is re-inforced by an expected increase in the rate of capital spending in the service sector and for housing. Expenditures for commercial building, institutions and for government facilities are all expected to be above anticipations at the first of the year and well

above the outlays made in 1954. It had originally been estimated that expenditures by housebuilders would be about 10 per cent greater than in 1954. It now appears that the increase will be more like 13 per cent.

The only major sector to have a downward revision of investment plans is the utilities group insofar as pipe line and seaway construction is not now expected to proceed as rapidly as anticipated earlier. These reductions more than offset increases in other utilities.

On the basis of present capital spending intentions it would appear that the strong activity in the construction industry which became apparent in the second quarter will continue for the balance of the year.

The following tables corresponding with those in "Private and Public Investment, Outlook 1955" provide detail on the results of the mid-year investment survey. It should be noted that because of the relative stability of repair expenditures no attempt was made to revise these estimates. The figures obtained from the original survey have been repeated in the following tables.
