MID-YEAR REVIEW 1957

The June survey of capital expenditure intentions of Canadian business, institutions, governments and housebuilders reveals that aggregate spending intentions have been revised moderately upward from those outlined at the beginning of the year.

Present plans call for outlays of close to \$8.8 billion in 1957 for new structures and for the acquisition of machinery and equipment. This represents an increase of 11 per cent over the \$7.9 billion estimated to have been spent for these purposes in 1956 and an upward revision of 3 per cent from the intentions as stated last January. The additional strength at mid-year results from larger expenditures for construction than had been previously anticipated. Construction spending is now expected to total \$5.8 billion, 10 per cent above the 1956 figure. The more moderate fall in housing outlays, 14 per cent compared with the original estimate of 17 per cent, along with added strength in non-residential construction, now planned at a rate 21 per cent above that of 1956, account for the increase. Projected purchases of machinery show little change from those outlined in the original intentions and are still expected to exceed those of last year by 13 per cent.

The somewhat better outlook for housebuilding reflects the improvement in housing starts that has taken place in recent months and the expectation that further improvements will occur as the year progresses. The present estimate provides for 97,000 new housing units to be started in the present year and 112,000 units to be completed.

By industry, the present capital expenditure programme shows little variation from that planned at the beginning of the year. The most important revisions occur in the various sectors of the fuel and power industry and in mining. Expenditure plans for petroleum and natural gas development and distribution, including pipe lines, have been revised substantially upwards. Added strength is apparent, too, in the provision of new facilities for the generation and distribution of electric power. At the start of the year, plans called for a slight decline in capital spending by the mining industry. The revised intentions indicate that outlays by this industry will be about 13 per cent above those of 1956, with added strength being shown in uranium developments. Most other sectors show little change from the previous intentions with very moderate upward revisions in some industries' being offset by equally moderate downward revisions in others.

This relative stability shown in the capital expenditure programme between January and mid-year suggests that little change has occurred in this period either in the factors stimulating investment or in those that might limit the accomplishment of the projects then planned. The June survey revealed that, relative to 1956, few new projects were being initiated in addition to those that had been planned when the original survey was made last fall. At the same time, very few of the projects planned earlier have been either cancelled or postponed. The questionnaire circulated in the mid-year survey requested the respondents to report specifically on any difficulties they were experiencing in implementing their capital programmes. The replies suggested that any delays occurring because of physical factors were of a minor nature. The number of firms reporting that their programmes were being delayed because of poor weather or labour or material shortages was relatively small. A number of the spending agencies, particularly among the institutions, reported that they were having difficulties in financing their projects. But reported cut-backs in spending attributed to such difficulties constituted a very small part of total capital expenditures. Prices, too, have contributed to the stability in the capital programme with only moderate increases occurring over the costs prevailing at the beginning of the year.

On the whole, the record capital expenditure programme planned for 1957 has been proceeding on schedule with some increased strength becoming apparent in a few industries. Supplies of both labour and materials appear adequate to permit the 1957 intentions to be accomplished.
