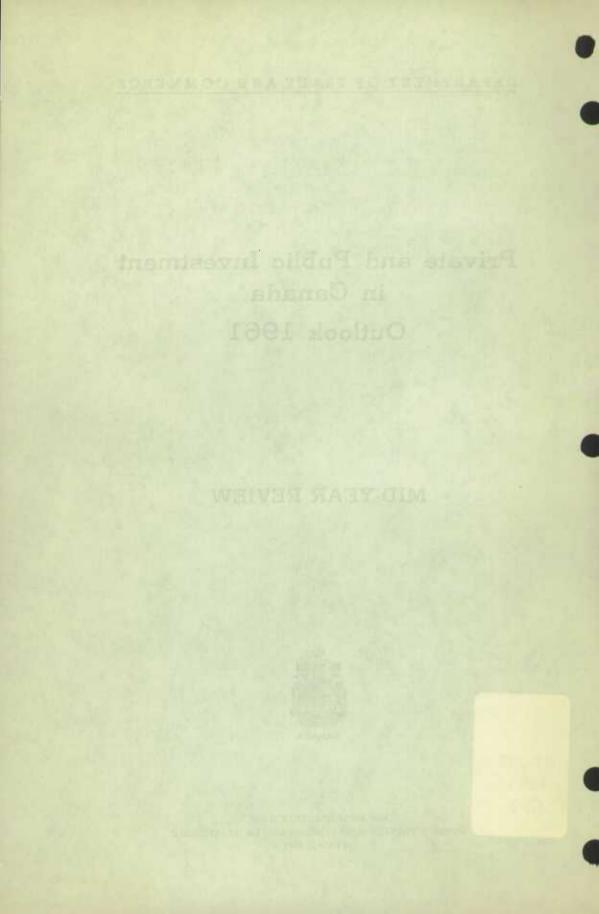

#### **MID-YEAR REVIEW 1961**

A recent survey of the capital expenditure intentions of all sectors of the Canadian economy revealed plans for total capital outlays of \$8.4 billion in 1961. This programme represents an increase of about 3 per cent over that of last year and is about \$100 million reater than the programme previously anticipated for 1961 when a similar survey was made at the beginning of the year.

This most recent survey was conducted in late May and in June and covered business establishments, institutions and all levels of government. The total figure includes, too, estimated outlays for housing. The estimates given here are directly comparable with those published in the March report "Private and Public Investment in Canada, Outlook 1961". Respondents were asked to revise only their estimates of capital spending. The figures shown for repair expenditures are simply a repetition of those appearing in the earlier report.

Within the total, plans for spending on non-residential construction have been revised moderately upwards, while projected outlays for housing and for the acquisition of machinery are little changed from the earlier anticipations. Present intentions would involve an increase of about 5 per cent over 1960 in expenditures for both housing and other types of construction. Machinery outlays, on the other hand, are still expected to be about 2 per cent below the levels of last year.

The mid-year survey revealed a somewhat greater strength in business investment in an had been suggested by the earlier survey and a slight moderation of plans in the area social capital. The planned business investment programme is about one per cent below that of 1960 and this compares with the 3 per cent decline that had been expected on her in the year. Expenditures for housing and social capital combined are expected to exceed those of 1960 by about 8 per cent, this is only fractionally below the earlier anticipation. Plans for business investment are now about \$100 millions greater than had near indicated by the earlier survey and accomplishment of these plans would bring such expenditures very close to those of last year. Expanded capital plans in the fuel power industries account for about one-half of the upward revision, planned outlays for oil pipe lines, gas processing plants and gas distribution facilities have all been i creased. Spending in the whole area of fuel and power is expected to show an increa of about 12 per cent over that of 1960. Also adding to the increased strength in busine investment are the somewhat larger expenditures anticipated in the forest and mineral products industries bringing outlays in this sector above those of 1960 and continuing the upward trend apparent since 1958. The added strength here is accounted for by moderate upward revisions in mining and in the mineral processing industries. The capital programmes of other major sectors of business investment are little changed but, on the whole, tend to be slightly above those formulated at the beginning of the year. A much lower level of expenditures than in 1960 by the transportation industry continues to be the major factor repressing business investment in the present year.

In the social capital sector the major revision of plans occurs in institutional investment. Outlays for new hospital facilities are now expected to be about 50 per cent greater than in 1960, this compares with the increase of 70 per cent that had been originally planned. Expansion plans of universities have also been scaled down but are still substantially above those of last year. Partially offsetting these downward revisions are expanded programmes for new schools and churches. In total, outlays for new institutional facilities are expected to be 17 per cent higher in 1961, this compares with the 21 per cent increase expected at the start of the year. Capital spending plans by governments have been slightly expanded, particularly at the municipal level, and involve an 8 per cent increase over such spending in 1960.

Estimates of housebuilding expenditures are unchanged from those published earlier, at 5 per cent above the levels of last year. During the first half of the year the number of new units started was sharply higher than in the same period of 1960, however, with fewer houses under construction at the start of the year, overall activity in the field showed only a modest improvement. The larger number of units now under construction may be expected to lead to an increasing rate of activity in the latter part of the year.

On the whole, these revised statements of investment intentions represent the formalizing of capital budgets that may have been only tentative at the time that the original survey was made. In addition they reflect any new decisions that may have been taken in the early part of the year and the effect that any unforeseen factors may have had on implementing capital spending plans. In general, firm decisions appear to have been taken to implement the programmes originally planned and additional new projects that have been initiated were more than sufficient to offset any that were postponed or cancelled. For the most part the data on investment intentions were received prior to the presentation of the recent Federal budget and the figures do not reflect any decisions that may have been made following the budget. Indications are that construction activity in the first half of the year has been somewhat slower than would be suggested by the intentions. A significant number of firms reported that their programmes were running behind schedule in the early part of the year and this was in part attributed to unfavourable weather conditions in Eastern Canada in the early spring. The accomplishment of the intentions outlined here will involve a more than seasonal improvement in construction activity for the balance of the year, which should add support to the recovery in the economy that has been recently apparent.

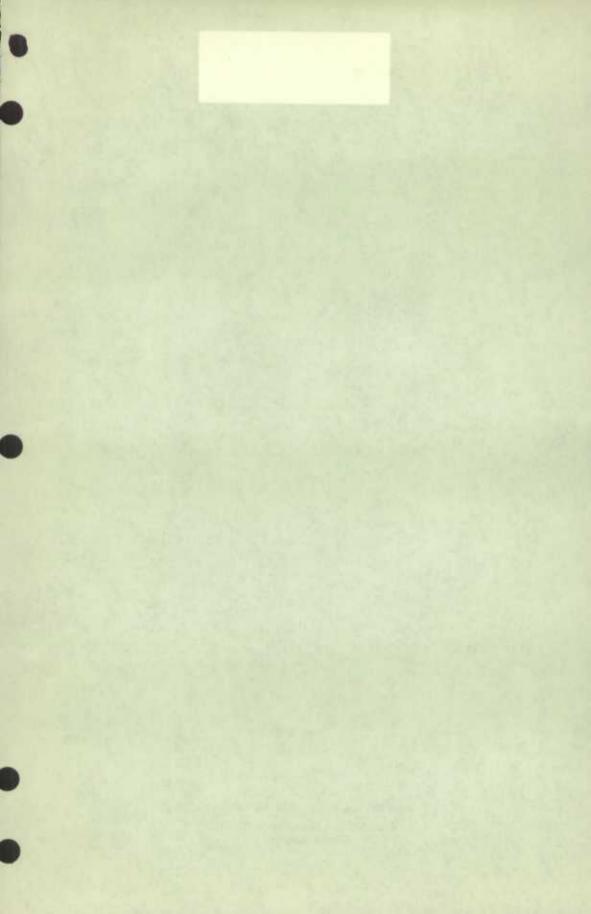
