MID-YEAR REVIEW - 1965¹

A recent survey of the capital spending intentions of all sectors of the Canadian economy, both private and government, indicates that investment plans for 1965 have been revised upwards since the previous survey was made at the beginning of this year. Present plans involve total capital outlays of \$12.8 billion as compared with previous intentions of \$12.3 billion. This programme, if accomplished, would represent an increase of four per cent over that anticipated earlier for this year and would be nearly 19 per cent above the 1964 level. In both value and volume terms such a capital expenditure programme would be the largest on record and would represent the sharpest annual increase in such spending since 1956. The accomplishment of the programme now planned would involve more than the normal seasonal increase from the high level achieved in the first quarter of the year and would provide a strong expansionary influence to the economy generally.

The recent survey was conducted in late May and June and covered business establishments, institutions, and all levels of government. The total figure also includes estimated outlays for housing. The estimates given here are comparable with those published in the March report "Private and Public Investment in Canada, Outlook 1965". Respondents in the survey were asked to revise only their estimates of capital spending, the figures shown for repair expenditures are the same as those appearing in the earlier report. Revised data are available only for national totals; no revision has been made of the regional figures published earlier.

Present plans involve a sharp increase in outlays both for construction and for machinery and equipment. Expenditures for new construction are expected to total \$8.3 billion. This is 19 per cent higher than outlays in 1964 and more than three per cent above the earlier estimate for 1965. Increases from the earlier intentions appear in both housing and non-residential construction. Machinery and equipment expenditures are expected to amount to \$4.5 billion in 1965, which is 18 per cent higher than in 1964 and six per cent above earlier anticipations.

The sharpest upward revisions in spending plans have been made in the area of business investment. These plans now provide for an 18 per cent increase from last year's expenditure compared with the 12 per cent rise anticipated in the earlier survey. This rate of increase is comparable with that achieved in the previous year. Outlays for housing and social capital are now expected to exceed original intentions by two per cent which raises capital spending in this category to a level 19 per cent above that of 1964.

The largest upward revisions of the original investment plans within the business sector appear in the goods producing industries, particularly in manufacturing and mining. Capital expenditure programmes of manufacturers have been increased by a further nine per cent bringing them to 33 per cent above actual outlays in 1964. While most manufacturing industries are spending more than originally intended, the major upward adjustments have occurred in the paper products, primary iron and steel, motor vehicles and textile industries. The expanded programme in the mining industry raises capital outlays in this area to a level a little above that of 1964. Previously some decline in such expenditures had been expected. The additional strength is principally apparent in outlays for oil and gas wells. The most important revisions to capital spending intentions in the service industries have been made in the utilities group. Largely as a result of expanded plans for power and telephone facilities, this group now expects to spend 15 per cent more than last year, an upward revision of six per cent from earlier intentions. The survey revealed, too, that the previously expected rise of more than 27 per cent in commercial investment may be even greater with an increase of over 29 per cent now planned. All of the additional strength in this sector originates in the trades group.

The survey confirms the very strong increase in social capital spending that was anticipated at the first of the year. At that time plans involved an increase of 22 per cent in such spending. Current intentions suggest an increase of 23 per cent. Within the total, institutional spending is expected to rise by about 30 per cent and government outlays (municipal, provincial and federal) by close to 20 per cent.

Expenditures on new housing in 1965 are expected to total \$2.3 billion or about 14 per cent higher than outlays in the previous year. It is now estimated that housing starts in the present year will exceed the 166 thousand level of 1964. The added impetus in housebuilding is coming from the initiation of new apartment units which is expected to continue at a very high level through the remainder of the year.

The accomplishment of the capital programme presently planned would entail a substantial increase in investment spending for the second consecutive year. This rapid rate of expansion is placing increasing pressures on the available supply of materials and labour. Perhaps of greatest importance from the standpoint of possible impediments to the accomplishment of investment plans is the growing shortage of skilled labour. By May of this year the reserve of skilled unplaced construction workers available for placement was one-third less than at the same date in either 1963 or 1964. This may make difficult to achieve the normal seasonal build-up in construction activity in the summer and early fall months. In such circumstances expansion programmes are more susceptible to delays resulting from supply limitations.

The further build-up of investment plans indicated by the survey adds to the demands on the construction, materials and equipment producing industries and reinforces the expansionary impetus in the economy generally. At the same time new capital facilities are being created at an increasing rate thus adding to the productive potential available to meet the rising demands of domestic and foreign consumers.
