## BUILDING PERMITS IN CANADA, JANUARY, 1940.

## INTRODUCTION

With the present report the statistics of building permits issued monthly and annually by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics are enlarged to include 201 municipolities instead of 58 as formerly. The return now include all municipalities which have systems of issuing permits.

A new table is included which shows a classification of all permits issued according to the proposed use of the building to be erected, altered or repaired. This classification is made up by provinces, and covers residential, institutional, commercial, industrial and "all other" structures. It also separates new construetion from additions, alterations, and repairs.

The table, showing values and average indexes for the preceding twenty years, has been enlarged, and now includes permits for the current and preceding months, as well as total values for the last twenty calendar years.

Average indexes of the values of building permits and of wholesale prices of building materials (1926=100) will be shown for the current month, together with the preceding twelvemonth period.

The value of permits issued by each municipality will be shown for the current month, the previous month, the corresponding month of last year, and the total amount for the past calendar year.

This report will continue to make comparisons of the 58 and 35 manicipalities as formerly.

## BUILDING PERMITS, JANUARY, 1940.

The January, 1940, report of building permits issued includes permits from 113 municipalities and has a value of $\$ 3,303,212$ with $\$ 2,313,868$ representing new construction, while repairs, alterations and additions, account for \$989,344.

Of the 201 municipalities in Canada which issue permits, 59 had nothing to report for January, while 29 failed to respond to our enquiries.

Reports were received from 54 of the 58 municipsiities which heretofore comprised this report. The value of permits issued by them amounted to $\$ 2,391,300$, while the total for the 35 municipalities was $\$ 2,196,975$. Corresponding values for December, 1939 , were $\$ 6,035,212$ and $\$ 5,399,870$ respectively.

The new and amplified tables referred to in the introduction to this report follow herewith.
