\text { BUILDING PFRMITS ISSUED IN CANADA, JANUARY, } 1943 .
$$

The January report of Building Permits includes returns from 156 of the 204 municipalities in Canada which have systens for issuing such permits and of this number 96 reported detailed operations. The remaining 60 advised that no permits had been issued during the month of January, while 48 municipalities had failed to report at the close of February 12th.

The total value of permits reported as issued in the month of January is $\$ 3,222,324$. Revised values for the month of Deceraber include returns from 203 municipalities and ageregate $\$ 6,625,430$. Reports were received from 53 of the 58 original municipalities and show a value of $\$ 1,625,893$ for January. The corresponding revised value of December, includes 58 returns and is $\$ 6,162,130$, while the January 1942 value was $\$ 4,246,246$.

The total value of permits issued by all municipalities durine the twelve elapsed months of the past year was $\$ 104,236,278$. The value of the 58 municipalities for the same period was $\$ 76,640,596$, while their corresponding value in 1941 was $\$ 101,047,815$.

During the month of January new construction of all types amounted to 72.3 per cont of the total value, while the percentage of new residential construction was 22.6.
