BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED IN CANADA, FEBRUARY, 1943.

The February report of Building Permits includes returns from 170 of the 204 municipalities in Canada which have systems for issuing such permits and of this number 107 reported detailed operations. The remaining 63 advised that no permits had been issued during the month of February, while 34 municipalities had failed to report at the close of March 12th.

The total value of permits reported as issued in the month of Febmary is $\$ 2,271,744$. Revised values for the month of January include returns from 200 mmicipalities and aggregate $\$ 3,338,329$. Reports were received fram 54 of the 58 original municipalities and show a value of $\$ 1,860,994$ for February. The corresponding revised value of January, includes 58 returns and is $\$ 1,701,393$, while the February 1942 value was $\$ 3,743,555$.

The total value of permits issued by all municipalities during the two elapsed months of this year is $\$ 5,610,073$. The value of the 58 municipalities for the same period is $\$ 3,562,387$, while their corresponding value in 1942 was $\$ 7,989,801$.

During the month of February new construction of all types amounted to 61.3 per cent of the total value, while the percentage of new residential construction was 39.9.
