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BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED IN CANADA, MARCH, 1945

The March report of Building Permits included returns from 176 of the 204 municipalities in Canada which have systems for issuing such permits and of this number 162 reported detailed operations. The remaining 14 advised that no permits had been issued during the month of March, while 28 municipalities had failed to report at the close of April 10th.

The total value of permits reported as issued in the month of March is \$12,421,167. Revised values for the month of February include returns from 203 municipalities and aggregate \$7,224,639. Reports were received from 56 of the 58 original municipalities and show a value of \$7,632,384 for March. The corresponding revised value of February includes 58 returns and is \$5,481,375 while the March 1944 value was \$5,078,885.

The total value of permits issued by all municipalities during the three elapsed months of this year is \$25,036,833. The value of the 58 municipalities for the same period is \$17,446,716, while their corresponding value in 1944 was \$13,427,963.

During the month of March new construction of all types amounted to 78.9 per cent of the total value, while the percentage of new residential construction was 49.6.

Table No. 4 is arranged so as to give complete information as to the number and description of new housing units (new building and conversions).
