## BUILDING PERMITS

OCTOBER 17, 1946
 Mumicipalities in Camada. In the month of October, 271 of these Mumicipalities reported that permits to the value of $\$ 30,570,258$ were issued by them. Thie represents an incrase of $\$ 1,523,073$ over the September value which was $\$ 29,047,185$, and also ahows an increase over the corresponding October 1945 value of $\$ 10,926,785$, or 55,6 per cent.

Permita for new construction in October were valued at $\$ 23,773,084$, wile additionn, alteratione ard repairs accounted for $\$ 6,797,174$.

For the $11 r s t$ ten months of the current year, the total value of permite 1 ssued was $\$ 331,583,312$. in comparison with $\$ 163,582,851$ for the same period of 1945 . This represents an increase of $\$ 168,000,461$, or 103 per cent.

Few housing units represented in the building permits issued in October by the reporting Municipalities numbered 3,277 of which 2,934 were aew bulidings and 343 were conversions. In October last year, 3,018 permits were is bued for housing units, including 2,796 for the construction of new bulldings and 22 f for conversions. The aggregate value of new residential buildings, additions and repairs thereto, was $\$ 14,563,988$ in October this year as compared with $12,646,947$ in October, 1945.

Permits for the construction of 39,332 new dwelling units were granted during the first ten month of the present year as compared with 24,461 in the same period of 1945 . The permits for 1946 included 35,997 for new bulldige and 3,235 for conversions. The value of new residential butldings, and aditiong and repairs amounted to $\$ 170,973,064$ during the first ten months of this year as compared with $\$ 101,423,652$ in the same perlod af 1945 .

The present report is based on returns recelved from 171 of the 204 selected Municipalitios in Canada which have facilities for iseung such permits and, of this number, 165 reported detad led operations. The remalaing six advised that no permits had beon 1 ssued during the month while 32 Municipalities falled to report by November 10 , at which time complations are proceeded with.

Taluse contained in one report could not be reconciled, and information is required from the Muricipality before the total shown in this report can be used.
