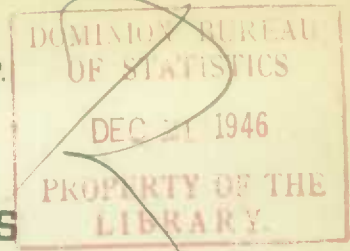


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BUILDING PERMITS

NOVEMBER, 1946

Every month the Dominion Bureau of Statistics collects details of building permits issued, from 204 selected Municipalities in Canada. In the month of November, 181 of these Municipalities reported that permits to the value of \$23,786,675 were issued by them. This represents a decrease of \$9,824,526 from the October value which was \$33,611,201, and shows an increase over the corresponding November 1945 value of \$5,628,104 or 30.9 per cent.

Permits for new construction in November were valued at \$18,818,908, while additions, alterations and repairs accounted for \$4,967,767.

For the first eleven months of the current year, the total value of permits issued was \$358,410,930, in comparison with \$181,741,422 for the same period of 1945. This represents an increase of \$176,669,508 or 97 per cent.

New housing units represented in the building permits issued in November by the reporting Municipalities numbered 2,766 of which 2,459 were new buildings and 307 were conversions. In November last year, 2,495 permits were issued for housing units, including 2,209 for the construction of new buildings and 286 for conversions. The aggregate value of new residential buildings, additions and repairs thereto, was \$12,624,085 in November this year as compared with \$9,993,002 in November, 1945.

Permits for the construction of 42,470 new dwelling units were granted during the first eleven months of the present year as compared with 26,956 in the same period of 1945. The permits for 1946 included 38,925 for new buildings and 3,545 for conversions. The value of new residential buildings, and additions and repairs amounted to \$183,597,149 during the first eleven months of this year as compared with \$111,416,654 in the same period of 1945.

The present report is based on returns received from 181 of the 204 selected Municipalities in Canada which have facilities for issuing such permits and, of this number, 173 reported detailed operations. The remaining eight advised that no permits had been issued during the month while 23 Municipalities failed to report by December 10, at which time compilations are proceeded with.
