## BUILDING PEFMITS ISSUED IN MARCH, 1946

Building permite iseued by munioipalities whioh reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistion reached the value of $\$ 35,733,524$ in Maroh, reoording a substantial inorease from the February total of $\$ 16,562,616$ and exoeeding the Maroh 1945 total of $\$ 12,782,715$ by 180 per oent. Pormits for now oonstruotion wore issued in March to the value of $\$ 27,993,653$ and addition, alterations and repirs. $77,739,971$. For the first three months of the ourrent year, permite were granted to the value of $\$ 67,566,938$ as compared with $\$ 25,401,381$ in the comparable period of 1945 , an edvance of 166 per oent.

New housing units represented in the bullding permite issued in Maroh by the roporting municipalities numbered 4,061 of whioh 3,600 were new buildinge and 381 were oonversions. In Maroh last year, 1,742 permita were 1swued for housing units, inoluding 1,490 for the oonstruotion of new buildings and 252 for oonversions. The aggregata value of now residontial buildinge, additions and repaire theroto, wea $\$ 17,862,627$ in Maroh this yoar as oompared with 7,326,522 in Marah, 1945.

Pormite for the nonstruotion of 8,034 now dwelling units were granted during the first three monthe of the present year os oompared with 3,647 in the sme period of 1945 . The pernite for 1540 inoluded 7,162 for new buildings and 872 conversions. The value of new residential buildings, and additions mind repairs thereto amounted to $334,116,160$ during the first thres montha of this year an ocompered with $\mathbf{1 1 3 , 1 7 6 , 7 7 9}$ in the same period of 1945 .

The present report is based on returns reoeived from 189 of the 204 munioipalities in Ganade whiah have systome for issuing suoh pormits and of this number 183 roported detailed operations, The romining 6 advised that no permits had been issued during the month, while 15 munioipalities had failed to report by April 12 , at whioh time ocmpilations are prooesded $\pi$ ith.
