## BUILDING PERRITS ISSUED IN JUNE, 1946

Building permita issuad by mumicipalities which reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reached the value of $\$ 2 b, 346,002$ in June, recording a deorease from the May total of $\$ 7,458,102$ but exceading the June 1945 total of $119,566,002$ by 30 per oent. Pormits for new comstruction wore $158 u 0 d$ in sune to the value of $\$ 21,190,437$ and additions, alteration and repairs, $14,155,565$. For the first six months of the current year, permits were granted to the value of $\$ 200,738,967$ as campared with $\$ 80,073,251$ in the comparable period of 1945 , an advance of 149 per cent.

New housing untis represented in the building permits issued in June by the reporting mumioipalitios numberad 3,310 of which 3,08 w wore now buildings and 225 were conversians. In june last yeer, 3 , 036 permits were issued for housing units, inoluding 2,816 for the construction of now bulldings and 220 for conversionc. The ageregate value of new residential buildings, additions and repairs thereto, was $315,425,023$ in June this year as compared with $\$ 13,145,968$ in June 1945.

Permita for the oonstruction of 24,924 now dwelling units were granted during the first aix months of the present year an oompared with 12,589 tn the same period of 2945 . The pormits for 2 vag included 22,858 for new buildings and 2,066 ouversions. The value of new residential buildinfis, and additions and repairs thereto amounted to \$103,016, 584 during the first $81 \pi$ month of this year as compared with $\$ 51,161,037$ in tho same poriod of 1945 .

The present report is based on returns received frum 168 of the 204 munioipalities in canada which have syntems for issuinf, wuch permits and, of this number, 166 reported detailed operations. The remaining 2 advised that no permita had boon issued during the month while 36 municipalities failed to report by june 12 , at which time oomptimtiona are proooeded with.
