BUILDING PERMITS ISSUED IN AUGUST, 1946

Building permits issued by municipalities which reported to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reached the value of \$25,759,214 in August, recording a decrease from the July total of \$34,083,984 and exceeding the August 1945 total of \$23,276,769 by 10.7 per cent. Permits for new construction were issued in August to the value of \$20,817,786 and additions, alterations and repairs, \$4,941,428. For the first eight months of the current year, permits were granted to the value of \$267,361,578 as compared with \$123,889,319 in the comparable period of 1945, an advance of 116 per cent.

New housing units represented in the building permits issued in August by the reporting municipalities numbered 3,422 of which 3,157 were new buildings and 265 were conversions. In August last year, 2,746 permits were issued for housing units, including 2,435 for the construction of new buildings and 311 for conversions. The aggregate value of new residential buildings, additions and repairs thereto, was \$15,461,546 in August this year as compared with \$11,524,438 in August 1945.

Permits for the construction of 32,040 new dwelling units were granted during the first eight months of the present year as compared with 18,363 in the same period of 1945. The permits for 1946 included 29,454 for new buildings and 2,586 for conversions. The value of new residential buildings, and additions and repairs amounted to \$137,948,254 during the first eight months of this year as compared with \$75,728,807 in the same period of 1945.

The present report is based on returns received from 162 of the 204 municipalities in Canada which have systems for issuing such permits and, of this number, 157 reported detailed operations. The remaining 5 advised that no permits had been issued during the month while 42 municipalities failed to report by September 10, at which time compilations are proceeded with.
