## BUILDING PERMITS <br> FEBRUARY, 1947

To ussure a more complate coverage the number of seleoted munioipalities listed in this February fulletin has been inereased fram 204 to 226 . However, it is not always possibls to have reoelved reports fram those seleated by the loth of the folloming month, the dead-ine date of iseue.

This Pebruary rejort includes returns fron 197 municipalities but the totale are not oanparable with the totals of any previous months for the following reasons: -
(a) Inoluded in the new list are soveral municipalitios in whioh building is vory active at the present time and whioh have reported large values of permits issued.
(b) Monthly municipalities, delinquent in reporting, are not alweys the same.

The question of the inolusion of additional ounioipalities in this monthly bulletir. farticularly town ships adjoont to the larger oitios whioh aro experienoing a large building expansion at the presont tione is being Riren serious oonsideration.

Munioipalities whioh have regular flow of permits issued and whioh could be dependec upon to submit their reports regularly to the Bureeu are the only caes whioh could be inoluded for ocmparative purpases.

Such a list could inolude same 400 munioipalities and it would frobably take sane time to establish it. Then the municipalities are definitely selectod, however, they should show a very lerfo proportion of all froposed new builaing in Canada.

The 197 municipalities, whose reports are inoluded in this Bulletin, show psraits to the value of 2it. 977,733 . Or this, new conetruction eocounts for $\$ 12,569,772$, while the balance of $\$ 4,627,961$ 18 oredited to additions, alterstions and repairs.

These permits, ir construotion is carried through, would areate total housing units to the number of $\$ 8,125,564$, of whioh $\$ 7,285,171$ would be new construotion, while $\$ 840,393$ ropresents additions, altarations and repairs.

These values and units are shown in dotail in fables 1 to is, and, while they are not ocmparable, oorres= ponding values otc. For 1946 heve been inoluded.
