VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA  
ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS  
NOVEMBER, 1957

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits in November totalled 101,577, showing practically no change from the same month last year.

Cumulative entries for the eleven months were about 3 per cent higher than the corresponding period of 1956.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.
