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## VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS JULY, 1957

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Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits totalled 543,995 in July, an increase of 0.4 per cent or 2,280 more crossings than in the same month of 1956. Cumulative entries for the first seven months were 4 per cent heavier than in the same period of the previous year.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Vehicles entering Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.

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
