


## VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS

## JANUARY, 1958

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits in January totalled 59,017, an increase of 22 per cent over the same month of 1957 and a new record for this month. Traffic was heavier in all parts of the country except the Atlantic provinces where there was a slight decrease.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a travellers' vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.
