VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS
APRIL, 1958

The volume of foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits totalled 122,523 in April, an increase of between 4 and 5 per cent and established a new record for the month. Cumulative entries for the first four months show little change from last year, the increase amounting to 486 vehicles.

NOTE: - Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.
