## ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS

JUNE, 1958

The number of foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits in June declined 7 per cent when compared with the same month of last year. Cumulative entries for the first six months of 1958 recorded little change from the previous year, the decrease amounting to some 5,900 vehicles or less than 1 per cent. Data for the period show a decline in the Atlantic Provinces and Central Canada while gains were reported for all the Western Provinces.

NOTE: - Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.
