VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLERS VEHICLE PERMITS
SEPTEMBER 1958

The number of foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits in September declined between 6 and 7 per cent when compared with the same month of last year. Data for New Brunswick are partially inflated due to a change in administrative procedure at certain ports. Cumulative entries for the first nine months were 1 per cent lower than the same period of 1957.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by vessel.
