## VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS NOVEMBER, 1951

Early snow reduced the volume of highway traffic from the United States in November, the number of vehicles entering on traveller's vehicle permits, at 76,000, being 5 per cent lower than in November, 1950. Total for the first 11 months was up 8 per cent with all provinces showing gains over last year.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles.
