Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in June totalled 292,300, an increase of 23 per cent over the previous year and a new record for the month. Traffic during the first six months was heavier in all parts of Canada except the Maritimes and showed an overall gain of 13 per cent.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles.
