Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in November totalled 88,048, an increase of 16 per cent over the previous year and a new record for the month. Nearly all regions shared in the advance. Cumulative totals for the first eleven months were two per cent higher than in the year before.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision.

Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
