VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS
JUNE, 1952

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in June almost equalled the record of June, 1951. The total at 289,200 was only 1,300 or less than one per cent lower than the former total. There were gains in New Brunswick, Alberta and the Yukon and losses in all other regions. Six month totals were up 7.5 per cent.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit.) Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles.
