ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS OCTOBER. 1953

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in October totalled 169,530, an increase of 21 per cent over the previous year and a new record for the month. Cumulative data for the first ten months show a gain of between 9 and 10 per cent with all provinces sharing in the increase.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit.) Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles.
