VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA  
ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS  
FEBRUARY, 1953

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits in February totalled 57,600, an increase of 10 per cent over the previous year and a new record for the month. The total for January and February was 16 per cent higher than in the year before. It should be noted, however, that each of these months normally accounts for only about 2 per cent of the annual total.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
