ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS AUGUST, 1953

A new monthly record was established in August for foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits. The number of entries was 546,100, an increase of 2 per cent over the former record in August 1952. The new record, however, is the lowest percentage increase for any month during 1953. Cumulative totals for the first eight months were 6 per cent higher than in the year before.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks, and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
