ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS
OCTOBER, 1954

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits totalled 162,211 in October, a decrease of over 4 per cent or 7,319 fewer vehicles than in the corresponding month of 1953. Cumulative entries for the first ten months of 1954 declined 2 per cent, the decrease amounting to 47,719 fewer vehicles for the period.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks, and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
