VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA
ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS
JUNE, 1954

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on traveller's vehicle permits totalled 274,154 in June, a decrease of 8 per cent or 23,462 fewer vehicles than the same month of 1953. Cumulative entries for the first six months declined 2 per cent, the decrease amounting to 12,859 vehicles with all provinces contributing except Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Yukon Territory.

NOTE: Traveller's vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
