VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLER'S VEHICLE PERMITS OCTOBER, 1955

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits totalled 167,754 in October, an increase of 5,541 or 3.4% over the corresponding month of 1954. Cumulative entries for the first ten months also show a gain of 3.4% or 78,281 vehicles when compared with the same period of last year.

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks, and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
