VOLUME OF HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ENTERING CANADA ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS OCTOBER, 1956

Foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers' vehicle permits totalled 164,666 in October, a decline of 2,897 crossings or 2 per cent lower than the same month of last year. The ferry service between Bar Harbour, Maine and Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, has contributed to the substantial increase in the number of vehicles being transported direct by vessel from the United States to Nova Scotia throughout the year.

NOTE: - Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a traveller's vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
