ON TRAVELLERS' VEHICLE PERMITS JUNE, 1956

A new record for the month of June was established in the number of foreign vehicles entering Canada on travellers vehicle permits. Entries totalled 320,390 an increase of between 10 and 11 per cent over the corresponding month of 1954 and nearly 8 per cent over the previous record for the month in 1953. Cumulative entries for the first six months show little change from last year, the decline amounting to some

NOTE: Travellers' vehicle permits are issued to foreign vehicles which remain in Canada longer than 48 hours or which travel beyond the jurisdiction of the port of entry. (Thus a motorist who intends to leave the country at a point other than that of entry must apply for a travellers' vehicle permit). Figures shown above refer almost exclusively to automobiles. They include a small number of taxis, motorcycles and bicycles, but exclude buses, trucks and other commercial vehicles. Data for current month are subject to revision. Entries into Canada via Newfoundland and Nova Scotia are by ship.
