AUGUST, 1946

Net sales of securities by Canada to all countries in August reached the lowest level of any month since December 1944. Net sales of \$4.1 million in August compare with \$8.3 million in July and \$22.3 million in June. Net sales of Canadian bonds to all countries of \$6.3 million accounted for almost all of the balance of sales of all securities. The volume of trading in Canadian and United States stocks, as in July was lower than in previous months with United States stocks showing a balance of sales of \$0.8 million. Net repurchases of Canadian stocks, amounting to \$2.6 million, were larger than in any single month for a number of years.

Net sales of securities to the United States amounted to \$6.9 million. Sales of Canadian bonds to the United States were \$6.5 million on balance, composed of Dominions \$5.1 million and other corporations \$4.2 million. All other Canadian issues traded with the United States were purchased on balance, the total for all issues amounting to \$0.8 million. Net repurchases of Canadian stocks from the United States amounted to \$1.2 million. There was a balance of sales of United States stocks of \$0.8 million and bonds of \$0.2 million.

Net repurchases of securities from the United Kingdom amounted to \$1.7 million; \$1.5 million repurchases of Canadian stocks, the remainder divided between most issues of Canadian bonds.

The security trade with other countries was at a high level with net repurchases of \$1.1 million, the largest in several years.

During the eight months ending August 1946, net sales of securities to all countries amounted to \$131.0 million compared with \$141.2 million in the corresponding period of 1945. This decrease results chiefly from lower net sales of United States securities which totalled \$18.9 million in 1946 as compared with \$27.7 million in 1945. During this period of 1946 net sales of Canadian bonds were \$4.4 million larger than in the same period of 1945, while net sales of Canadian stocks were \$4.1 million lower than in 1945.

In Table 4 showing quotations and yields for domestic government bonds in Canada, the United Kingdom and the United States, the Canadian issue remained relatively unchanged, the United Kingdom issue increased slightly while the United States issue declined moderately.

In Table 5 giving the index numbers of common stocks prices in Canada and the United States, there were moderate declines in each index.

The international trade in securities shown by statistics in this bulletin was carried on through the medium of the investment dealers, stock exchanges, banks, Canadian branches of United States houses and other agencies in Canada. It should be noted that certain types of international security transactions are not included in these statistics. Besides some transactions carried on directly outside of Canada independently of the reporting agencies, the most important group of security transactions not included are new issues of Canadian securities floated abroad, the redemption of called or matured Canadian bonds owned abroad, and official repatriation operations. For a period of years, retirements of Canadian bonds owned outside of Canada have exceeded flotations of new issues abroad by substantial amounts. Statistics of these capital movements are included in the annual reports of the <u>Canadian Balance of International Payments.</u>
