SALES AND PURCHASES OF SECURITIES BETWEEN CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRIES JANUARY, 1947.

Net sales of securities by Canada to other countries were \$3.3 million in January as compared with net repurchases of \$2.8 million in December and net sales of \$17.7 million in January, 1946. Trading in Canadian bonds, principally Dominion and other corporation issues, with sales balances of \$4.5 million and \$4.8 million respectively, more than offset net repurchases of Canadian stocks of \$6.1 million.

Net sales of securities to the United States amounted to \$2.4 million. Sales of Canadian bonds to the United States were \$9.0 million on balance, composed of Dominions \$4.0 million, other corporations \$3.9 million and municipals \$1.1 million. Net repurchases of Canadian stocks from the United States amounted to \$6.3 million and net repurchases of United States stocks were \$0.5 million.

Net repurchases of securities from the United Kingdom amounted to \$0.5 million: \$0.4 million repurchases of provincial issues and \$0.2 million repurchases of railway bonds. During January there were net sales of Canadian stocks of \$0.1 million, the first favourable trade balance in Canadian stocks for several years.

The volume of trade with other countries was larger than in any single month since August 1939. There were net sales of \$1.4 million, comprising other corporations \$0.8 million and Dominion issues \$0.3 million.

In Table 4 showing quotations and yields for domestic government bonds in Canada, the United Kingdom and the United States, the Canadian issue remained unchanged, while the United Kingdom and the United States issues registered slight increases.

In Table 5 giving the index numbers of common stocks prices in Canada and the United States, the Canadian and United States industrials remained relatively stable, while mining stocks advanced moderately.

The international trade in securities shown by statistics in this bulletin was carried on through the medium of the investment dealers, stock exchanges, banks, Canadian branches of United States houses and other agencies in Canada. It should be noted that certain types of international security transactions are not included in these statistics. Besides some transactions carried on directly outside of Canada independently of the reporting agencies, the most important group of security transactions not included are new issues of Canadian securities floated abroad, the redemption of called or matured Canadian bonds owned abroad, and official repatriation operations. For a period of years, retirements of Canadian bonds owned outside of Canada have exceeded flotations of new issues abroad by substantial amounts. Statistics of these capital movements are included in the annual reports of the Canadian Balance of International Payments.


