Sales and Purchases of Securities Between Canada and Other Countries

March, 1937

The large volume of Canada's international trade in securities was maintained in March. The net result of the rise in purchases and the drop in sales during the month was a reduction in the balance of sales to less than \$4 million. A shift in the trade between Canada and the United States was chiefly responsible for the reduced balance of sales. In this trade with the United States, there was a change from the net selling position of the previous month to a net buying position.

The bulk of the trade in March continued to be in Canadian and United States securities, although the proportion in United States securities was more than in February. In March, sales of Canadian securities were about 48 per cent of the total, sales of United States securities were about 42 per cent, and United Kingdom securities about 4 per cent; whereas Canadian securities were about 49 per cent of the total purchases and United States securities about 46 per cent.

As contrasted with February when net sales of Canadian securities were large, in March the net sales of Canadian securities were only a little over \$1 million and were concentrated in the sales of bonds, there being only a small balance in the total trade in common stocks. At the same time, there were net purchases by Canadians of three classes of Canadian bondsprovincials, municipals and the bonds of corporations other than railways.

The principal development in the composition of the trade with the United States was in the growth of the trade in United States stocks. In the trade with the United Kingdom, on the other hand, the transactions in Canadian common and preference stocks continued to predominate with the balance of sales characteristic of recent months. Sales of Canadian common and preference stocks to countries other than the United Kingdom and the United States were somewhat heavier than in recent months.

In the first quarter of 1937, total sales to all countries were \$194.8 million as contrasted with \$128.2 million and \$65.9 million in the same period in 1936 and 1935 respectively. Total purchases from all countries were \$184.1 in this part of 1937 compared with \$89.5 in the comparable part of 1936 and \$60.4 million in 1935.

As shown in the supplementary tables, the Canadian dollar strengthened slightly during the month, the average of daily quotations for United States funds in Montreal being at a discount while the premium on sterling declined. While the index number of common stock prices in the United Kingdom fell abruptly, the index of stock prices in Canada continued to rise to the highest position attained in recent years, and the United States index advanced only slightly from its position of the previous month. The rate of decline in the price of the United Kingdom 3½% War Loan was reduced in March, while the price of the two Canadian bonds shown continued to decline and the price of the United States issue declined more rapidly than in the previous month.

The international security transactions shown in this bulletin were carried on through the medium of the investment dealers, stock exchanges, banks, United States branch houses and other agencies in Canada. The sale of new issues of Canadian securities to syndicate members resident outside of Canada are not included in these figures, such as the new issues of \$85,000,000 Dominion of Canada bonds sold in January, 1937, to a syndicate in New York. The redemption of called or matured Canadian securities abroad and of British and foreign securities owned in Canada are not included among the transactions recorded.
