

STATISTICS ON THE OPERATIONS OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT

MONTHLY REPORT

During February and March the increasing number of claims for benefit under the Unemployment Insurance Act, noticed in previous reports since October last, has continued. The rate of increase, however, is falling off. In March 5,046 claims were filed, compared with 4,822 in February, 4,637 in January, and 3,337 in December. More applications for benefit payments were received in March than in any previous month.

At the same time the number of applications for employment by insured persons, and the insured applicants unplaced at the end of the month, declined slightly in February over January.

The number of persons receiving benefit, the number of days' benefit paid and the amount of benefit paid in February and in March also exceed the figures for any previous month. The proportion of those considered entitled to benefit who actually commenced receiving it was 90 p.c. in March and 73 p.c. in February, compared with 53 p.c. in January. The average duration of the unemployment compensated was 17.5 days in March and 16.9 days in February, compared with 15.8 days in January. The average amount paid per beneficiary was \$32.95 in March, \$31.80 in February, and \$29.67 in January. In March the average amount paid per compensated day of unemployment stood at \$1.89, in February \$1.88, and in January \$1.88.

The increases in the above averages indicate a lengthening in the duration of cases of compensated unemployment, just as the increasing number of claimants indicates an increasing incidence of unemployment among insured persons. Over the past year the monthly figures on claims lodged show a striking seasonal variation, with the low point in October and the high points in March.

The following tables set forth the pertinent data regarding the number of claims filed, their disposition, the reasons for non-entitlement to benefit, employment applications by insured persons, number of beneficiaries, number of days' benefit paid, and amount of benefit paid during February and March, 1943.
