

STATISTICS ON THE OPERATIONS OF THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT

MONTHLY REPORT - AUGUST, 1943.

During August, 1,370 applications for benefit payments were registered at the local offices of the Unemployment Insurance Commission across Canada. This compares with 1,855 claims filed during August 1942 and 1,772 and 1,087 filed, respectively, in June and July 1943.

The number of applications for employment by insured persons during the period July 2 to July 29 was 167,810, and during the period July 30 to September 2 it was 195,363. On July 29th, 43,929 of these applicants were listed as unplaced, while on September 2nd, 45,918 were unplaced. Under present circumstances these figures must be interpreted with care, since many special factors enter into their composition. According to existing National Selective Service regulations each separation from employment (with few exceptions) is funneled through the employment offices. This is true even of transfers from one employer to another where no actual unemployment occurs, and is true also of persons transferred by the various "compulsory transfer orders". Each of these transfers is recorded as a registration for employment and as a placement.

Many of the employment applications result from registration of persons who remain at work pending a transfer to other employment. An applicant is listed as unplaced until his placement in a vacancy to which he has been referred has been verified, or until his application becomes "dead" through lapse of time and his failure to report (an application can lapse, of course, under present circumstances only in respect of a person to whom National Selective Service regulations do not apply). Thus, many of the "unplaced applicants" are persons who are presently employed.

During August, 1,104 persons were paid a total of \$28,39% benefit as compensation for 16,467 days. In July, 1,868 persons received a total of \$45,581 for 25,166 days of compensated unemployment. These may be compared with the 1,679 persons who were paid \$39,296 for 22,537 days during August 1942. It follows then that during August of this year the average duration of the unemployment compensated was 14.9 days, as compared with 13.5 days in July, and 13.4 days in August 1942.

The average amount paid per beneficiary was \$25.72 during August, and \$24.40 in July, while in August 1942 it was \$23.41.

During the same months the average amount paid per compensated day of unemployment was \$1.72 in August, as against \$1.81 in July, and \$1.74 in August 1942.

Tables A to F, following, present the pertinent data on claims lodged, their disposition, chief reasons for non-entitlement to benefit, employment applications by insured persons, insured applicants unplaced, persons receiving benefit, benefit days paid and amount of benefit paid, by provinces, during August, 1943, with comparative figures for August, 1942.
